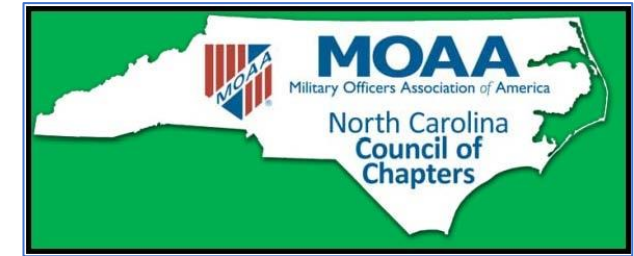
Legislative Goals

- Pass 4 DSLO-identified laws to make NC a military **GREEN** state (Two of four passed NC House and Senate)
 - Occupational Therapy Licensure Compact (Bill passed in House 29 March and in Senate 30 March)
 - In-State Tuition Continuity (Bill passed in House 11 March and in Senate 27 March)
- “Advocacy in Action 2021” Campaign underway-Ends end of May
- Working with North Carolina Veterans Council (NCVC)
 - Gaining advocacy support
 - Only one of seven NC MOAA initiatives accepted for action by NCVC
 - Remaining six forwarded to NC Department of Military Affairs and Veterans Affairs (DMVA) for consideration

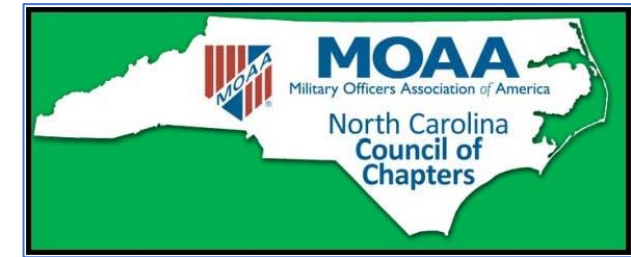

As you are reading this, MOAA's annual advocacy campaign, Advocacy in Action, is well underway. We need you – our readers and advocates – to contact your legislators and ask them to support this year's campaign priorities. The global COVID-19 pandemic has caused many organizations, including MOAA, to adjust their advocacy strategies. In MOAA's efforts to never stop serving, the organization continues to be a voice for you, our members, and the entire uniformed services and veteran communities – even in a virtual environment. MOAA's annual spring advocacy campaign, Advocacy in Action, will be conducted online this year, similar to last year's campaign. MOAA is engaging Congress on three issues for the campaign this year:

- 1. Comprehensive Toxic Exposure Reform**
- 2. TRICARE Young Adult Parity**
- 3. Basic Needs Allowance**

Call your legislator

One of the easiest ways to engage with your lawmakers is to call their office. You may do so toll-free via MOAA's direct line to the congressional switchboard at (866) 272-6622. Just ask the Capitol operator to connect you with your legislator's office. You likely will talk to a staff or legislative assistant for your member of Congress; their job is to hear your concerns and relay them to the senator or representative.

Use MOAA's Take Action Center

Members of Congress may also be reached via email. An effective way for MOAA members to contact their elected officials through email is by using our Take Action Center. Not only can you use the Take

Action Center to find out who your elected officials are, you can also use our pre-made templates to send messages to Congress on this year's campaign topics. Messages on the Take Action Center can be customized, and MOAA encourages our members to add personal notes to these emails.

Write a letter

Another way to make your voice heard is by writing a letter to your elected official. Typically, a member of Congress prefers letters on legislative issues be sent to their Washington, D.C., office. To find your elected official's D.C. address, visit www.house.gov/representatives/find-your-representative or www.senate.gov/senators/senators-contact.htm.

Elected officials often receive high volumes of correspondence from their constituents, so it may take a few weeks for you to receive a response.

You can also take advantage of the letters in the April issue of *Military Officer*. These letters are preaddressed to the leaders of the House and Senate. Please use these in addition to any other correspondence or calls to your senators and representative.

Engage on social media

Connecting with your elected officials on social media is an excellent way to stay up to date on their priorities. Popular social media platforms like Facebook, Twitter, and Instagram

allow lawmakers and their staff to stay connected with their constituents on issues important to their district or state.

MOAA often participates in social media campaigns to interact with members of Congress. Elected officials typically provide their social media information on their websites.

Stay informed and connected

Keep yourself informed on the Advocacy in Action campaign by visiting our website for regular updates. Also, make sure you are subscribing to *The MOAA Newsletter* to receive weekly emails to help you stay current on all of MOAA's legislative efforts, including the campaign.

With the support of our membership's advocacy efforts, MOAA will continue to strive toward meaningful legislative reform that will positively impact those who serve and have served, and their families, and survivors.

We encourage our members to take advantage of MOAA's many resources to stay informed, educate others, and serve as advocates in their communities for this year's advocacy campaign.

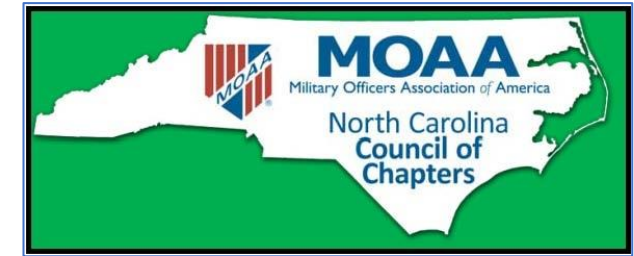

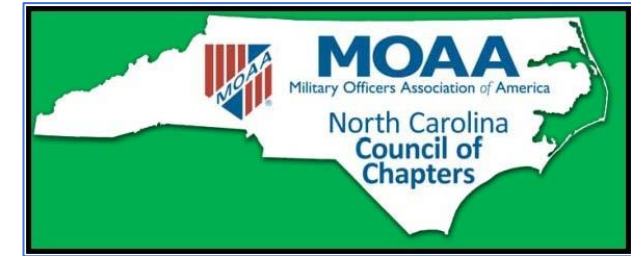

NCCOC Membership Goals – FY 2021



Goal: Eleven (11) chapters with 100% National Membership

- Currently, nine (9) of fourteen (14) NC chapters have 100% of their membership who are National MOAA members

Goal: Decrease CM non-National Membership by 50%

- January 1, 2021, we had 86 non-National members in our CMs. As of April 30, 2021, we have 39. We reclaimed 47 members

Goal: Add 200 new members by December 31, 2021

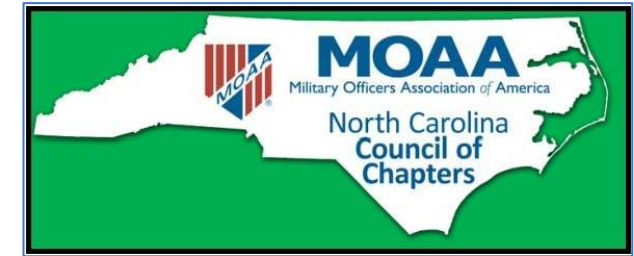
- As of April 30, 2021, we have added 65 new members

Goal: Add Five new Satellites by December 31, 2021

- One Satellite established - Goldsboro
- Two more Satellites ongoing - pending COVID restrictions

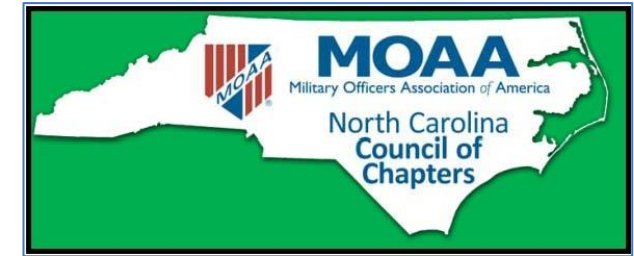
NCCOC Membership Incentive Program



- Chapters receive \$10 for each new member for new members totaling less than 25% of their total membership
- Chapters receive \$15 for each new member for all new members when the new members total 25% or more of their total membership.

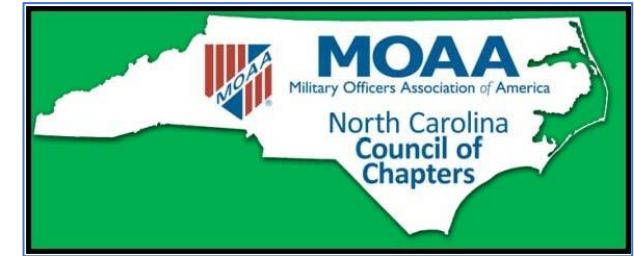
Annual Recruiting Incentive (Premium and Life)



Chapters will earn \$15 for every incentive-qualified PREMIUM member, and \$30 for every incentive qualified LIFE member who is new or upgrades membership level during the calendar year. An incentive-qualified member is one who has NOT been a national MOAA member in the preceding three years (except in the case of upgrades). Incentives will be paid by EFT in January of 2022.

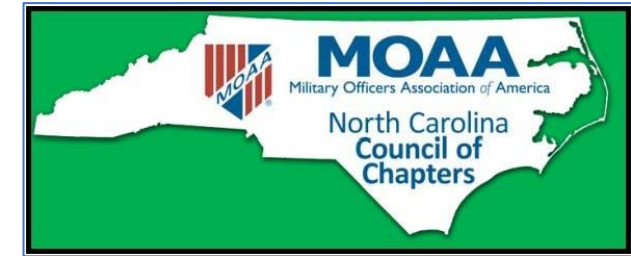
Chapters will receive a \$50 bonus for that quarter if they are using the following tools/resources by the last day of the quarter as follows:

- 1st quarter, January 1 – March 31 (extended to April 31): Chapter is subscribed to MOAA's Online Chapter Member Dues program and dues and/or donation(s) are made using the platform anytime between May 2020 and April 31st 2021. Self-report is not necessary.
- 2nd quarter, April 1 – June 30: Chapter has an active website or self-populated MOAA web presence. Self-report with URL required to chapters@moaa.org by June 30.
- 3rd quarter, July 1- September 30: New Association Management System implementation, details TBD.
- 4th quarter, October 1 – December 31: Chapter held an event (may be virtual) sometime during the year to increase community awareness of the chapter AND reports it on a Levels of Excellence (LOE) submission in 2022.

Reminders and instructions to submit information, where required, will be sent prior to award determination.

Piedmont (NC-14)

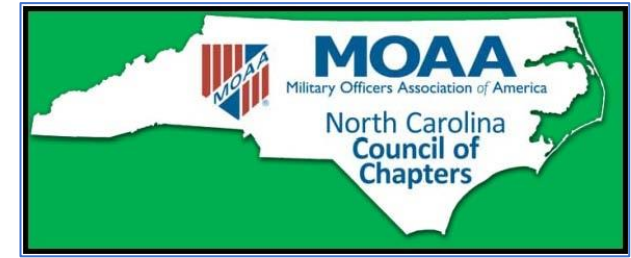
